Method #2. Determine the rate per hour Multiply the rate per hour by the drip rate Divide the total by 60 (minutes) - converts rate per hour to rate per minute. Example: Rate is 125 mL/hr IV set delivers 15 drops per mL 125 mL/hr x 15 drops/ mL = 31.25, rounded to 31 drops per minute. 60 minutes.
